During this reporting period, the State of Alaska has continues to work to create a statewide interoperability governance board (SIGB) which would incorporate stakeholders representing those with an interest in the FirstNet network, researching and evaluating technical solutions and educating the public at various meetings regarding FirstNet and the concept of building a Public Safety Broadband Network. We had a NTIA SLIGP Program Office site visit on August 18 and 19, 2014 in Anchorage, Alaska. Attending for Alaska were the SPOC, the statewide 911 coordinator, and the Alaska Department of Public Safety Grants Manager. Two members of Alaska's FirstNet team including the SPOC traveled to an OEC ICTAP Broadband Planning Workshop held in Lihue, Kauai on July 1 and 2, 2014. An initial planning meeting of the Alaska Interoperable Executive Committee (AKIEC) was held on July 10, 2014 in Anchorage, Alaska and while the meeting was not exclusively about FirstNet, FirstNet provided the impetus for the meeting and the SPOC make a presentation about FirstNet which constituted about 30 percent of the material discussed. Alaska's SPOC also made a short FirstNet presentation at the annual business meeting of the combined Alaska APCO / NENA chapter in Soldotna, Alaska on September 24, 2014.
