Alabama held its quarterly Alabama First Responder Wireless Commission meeting that included commissioners from multiple professional associations and public safety communication agencies. Alabama hosted representatives from FirstNet for our Initial Consultation Meeting July 15th in Huntsville, AL. Members of the Alabama First Responder Wireless Commission along with representatives from various first responder agencies from around the state was in attendance. Specific overviews of Fire, EMA, EMS, Law-Fusion Center, and SLIGP programs were given.
