In February, FirstNet and the SPOC teams from Arizona, New Mexico and Utah met with the Navajo Nation and Hopl Tribes to update the tribes on FirstNet and the states' planning process to engage tribal leadership as well as law enforcement, emergency management and telecommunications personnel. There were two sessions (morning and afternoon), both very well attended. The FirstNet and Arizona team later met with the Indian Country Intelligence Network (ICIN) for a similar presentation. ICIN is the only organization of its kind in the US, representing Arizona tribal law enforcement. Arizona continues to work effectively with the FirstNet team and strives to co-present at as many venues as possible.
