The results of the data collection included comprehensive coverage and capacity analysis, review of existing contracts and providers as well as a thorough understanding of potential NPSBN users, ove the next 25 years. All information was provided to FirstNet and was included in their RFP process.

Colorado will use SLIGP 2.0 to assess the FirstNet/AT&T coverage when requested by existing and potential users of the NPSBN.

Colorado used its SLIGP funds to support signficant outreach, education and data collection efforts. It became evident that this change was made to force states into an 'opt-in' decision as opposed to being provided the opportunity to complete a full review of the decision and make the best choice for its first responders.
