Narrative description for each activity reported in Question 11 for this quarter; any challenges or obstacles encountered and mitigation strategies you have employed; planned major activities for the next quarter; and any additional project For April 1, 2019 through June 30, 2019 Connecticut Staff continued collecting coverage and capacity gap information for AT&T to be aware of and consider in their future build out plans. Three Governance Group (SIEC) meetings were held, one each month for April, May, and June 2019. Two CT Staff members participated in the quarterly conference call with NTIA Staff. The FirstNet biweekly information updates were sent out to members of the Governance Group and Broadband Working Group, who in turn sent them out to to their discipline contacts. The Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection, Division of Emergency Management and Homeland Security is conducting an evaluation of FirstNet Services using iPhone8 and iPhone10 devices in order to determine what is most appropriate for our transition to FirstNet. On May 24, 2019 CT SLIGP Staff met with AT&T and FirstNet representatives to discuss specific coverage and capacity issues experienced by two mid-sized Connecticut municipalities which transistioned to FirstNet. On June 6, 2019 a member from the CT SLIGP Staff represented the CT Governance Group at a full day class at the Connecticut Fire Academy facilitated by FirstNet Program Manager Michael D. Varney. This class covered various levels from the basics of FirstNet to a group discussion regarding the possible uses in support of emergency responses. Participants included members of a very small fire department to technical staff from a very large sized municipal fire department.
