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# State of Connecticut Application Narrative State and Local Implementation Grant Program 2.0

## **SLIGP 2.0 Activities**

The State of Connecticut, through staff assigned to assist with the State and Local Implementation Grant Program (SLIGP), will focus its efforts on the following allowable activities:

- Single officer and staff to provide, at a minimum, for ongoing coordination with NTIA and implementation of grant funds.
- The existing governance body [Connecticut Public Safety State Interoperability Executive Committee, and subcommittee, Broadband Working Group] to provide input to the State Single Point of Contact (SPOC) and to contribute towards planning activities to further identify potential public safety users of the Nationwide Public Safety Broadband Network (NPSBN), and prepare for data sharing.
- Data collection in specific areas identified to be helpful as requested by FirstNet.
- Planning efforts to help FirstNet gain inclusion on applicable statewide contract vehicles.
- Identifying and documentation of on-going coverage needs/gaps within the state.
- Activities to convene stakeholder outreach events to continue planning for (NPSBN) implementation, as requested by FirstNet.

### **Capacity to Manage and Conduct Programmatic Activities**

The State of Connecticut has appointed Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection Deputy Commissioner William J. Hackett as the State Single Point of Contact (SPOC) to manage this program. The SPOC will continue with the very successful model of using the Connecticut Public Safety State Interoperability Executive Committee (SIEC) as the primary governance body, with additional state partners involved in the statewide technical implementation of standards. The Broadband Working Group, a sub-group of the SIEC, will focus on specific broadband data collection, support to FirstNet, including working with FirstNet to set standards for users, recommend policies, and report their activities to stakeholders and the SIEC.

Both the SIEC and the Broadband Working Group have very diverse members which represent various emergency services agencies, subject matter/technical experts, and State contracting professionals.

The State of Connecticut staff members assigned to the State and Local Implementation Grant Program have extensive experience and knowledge in the area of public safety telecommunications services. The grant program will be supported by several State agencies as well as local partners, some of which are identified below.

Within the Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection (DESPP) is the Division of Statewide Emergency Telecommunications (DSET). This entity and its units are responsible for various statewide communications projects/systems including the statewide 800 MHz trunked radio system and the ITAC-ICALL system.

DESPP and the State of Connecticut Chief Information Officer have jointly engaged in various communications planning projects in the past including BTOP and State-funded Public Safety Data Network (PSDN) which connects every fire service organization, law enforcement organization, public safety answering point, key communications tower facilities and other critical infrastructure within the state on a high-speed fiber optic network.

## **High-Level Staffing Plan**

This project will be led by DESPP Deputy Commissioner William J. Hackett, who also serves as the State Single Point of Contact (SPOC) and the Connecticut Statewide Interoperability Coordinator (SWIC). Support will include staff from the State of Connecticut Department of Administrative Services/Bureau of Enterprise Systems and Technology (DAS/BEST) and other staff from the State's Chief Information Office, as well as staff from the DESPP/DSET. Deputy Commissioner Hackett also served as the SPOC for the first State and Local Implementation Grant Program.


Emergency Management Program Specialist Robert Drozynski will serve as the Alternative Single Point of Contact (A-SPOC) and be responsible for grant management activities and providing outreach and administrative support. Robert Drozynski also served as the A-SPOC for the first State and Local Implementation Grant Program.

Director of Unified Communications, Leonard Welch, from the Department of Administrative Services/Bureau of Enterprise Systems and Technology (DAS/BEST) will serve as the Chair of the Broadband Working Group. This group both gathers information from and distributes information to stakeholders. The working groups reports to the Statewide Interoperable Executive Committee (SIEC) and the SPOC.

Telecommunications Engineer 1, Scott Wright from Division of Statewide Emergency Telecommunications (DESPP/DSET) will continue to serve as a working group member and subject matter expert. He will assist with providing insight into broadband operations, emergency communications technology changes, and public safety integration efforts.

The current Broadband Working Group will remain active. This group consists of subject matter experts from various emergency response disciplines and also includes representation from the tribal nations. The Broadband Working Group will represent and provide outreach to their respective disciplines, and also assist with data collection as needed.
