Idaho's contract for a crowdsourcing tool completed midway through Q10 and Idaho has implemented the crowdsourcing tool during this Quarter (Q10). Our focus continues to be remaining in contact with the Governance Boards, Local Emergency Planning Committees (LEPC), and local Agencies to provide assistance as needed with questions or issues they might have with FirstNet/AT&T. Idaho SLIGP has attended four governance meetings during this quarter, either in person or virtually. Meetings took place in DIGB 2 & 4, and 2 ISPCC's. Idaho's SLIGP personnel did not attend any broadband conferences during Q10, as Broadband Conferences scheduled were either postponded or cancelled. Idaho SLIGP will continue attending governance meetings and conferences/Expo's that we would normally attend. Physical attendance will resume when those Conferences/Expo's become available again and Covid-19 restrictions are lifted.
