Idaho continues to maintain strong working relationships with FirstNet, AT&T, and local/state governance board members to include their constituents. Idaho is offering a crowdsourcing tool to State and Local agencies to evaluate and confirm
the progress of AT&T's coverage results from IOC2 completion areas as outlined by the FirstNet State Plan. Our focus is now balanced between working with Governance Boards, Local Emergency Planning Committees (LEPC), and assisting in
coverage validation throughout Idaho. We have identified the LEPC's as our best source of new public safety users, as they are predominately attended by actual First Responders. The Idaho SLIGP team attended 8 governance meetings during
this quarter. Meetings took place in DIGB 2, 3 and 4, Twin Falls County LEPC, 2 ISPCC meetings and 2 Emergency Manager Workshops in the Southwest and Southcentral districts. Idaho's SLIGP personnel attended the following broadband
conferences; 2 individuals to the Idaho Telecom Alliance Conference, 8 individual's to the APCO Conference, 2 individuals to the ISE Conference, 1 individual to the RECWG COMMEX, and 1 individual to the Western Telecom Association meeting.
In Q8, Idaho plans to participate in two (2) broadband oriented conferences and four (4) or more governance oriented meetings with stakeholders at the state and local level.
