EVALUATING OFFICE LOCATIONS

Management Process for Analyzing Preferred Office Locations

- 1. Align with the FEMA/DHS regions (not adjust the states in a region).
- Leverage collocation by putting a regional office with the Headquarters or technical office.
- 3. Establish public safety experience centers with/near two regional offices preferable east and west of Mississippi.
- 4. Maximize proximity to user communities (minimize travel).
- 5. Identify and evaluate proximity to major airports.
- 6. Find locations that will increase talent pool (technical, PS and operational).
- 7. Leverage proximity to key Dept of Commerce and Public Safety constituents
- 8. Collocate technical and outreach staff, wherever possible
- 9. Distribute Operations and Technology resources nationwide based on operational demands
- 10. Geographically dispersed hardened Network Operation Centers and data centers will be determined at a later time.
- 11. Develop additional information needed for National Environmental Policy Act review and documentation of locational decision.
