11a. Narrative description for each activity reported in Question 11 for this quarter; any challenges or obstacles encountered and mitigation strategies you have employed; planned major activities for the next quarter; and any additional project

The SPOC position is fully funded by the SLIGP 2.0 grant. The Office of Information Technology Director of Communications and Administration was 55% match for this grant for part of the quarter with the balance of the match for the quarter provided by the Office of Information Technology Director of Radio Operations who oversees the state radio network (MSCommNet). There was no governance team meeting during this quarter. FirstNetME team members continued the education and outreach efforts as either approved by FirstNet or requested by FirstNet and/or AT&T. The FirstNet-approved event was a one "make-up session" for a group of public safety answering point (PSAPs) personnel. The original event (the first of six held during the fall of 2018 held in November was lightly attended due to a weather event so another was scheduled for and held on January 31, 2019. Other events where FirstNetME had presence in order to discuss the project and give status updates, sometimes in conjunction with AT&T were: two Maine NENA and one Maine e911 Advisory Council meetings; and a meeting of the sixteen (16) county emergency management agency directors. AT&T and FirstNetME shared booth space at: the Maine Chiefs of Pollice Association annual convention; the Maine Fire Chiefs Association annual convention; the Maine State Chamber of Commerce event held in the Hall of Flags of the State House. Also during the quarter were an quarterly update meeting with AT&T, FirstNetME representatives and an NTIA desk review of the SLIGP 2.0 grant management activities. Two individuals who contribute toward the Match requirement traveld to IMCE in Las Vegas and accounted for thier time accordingly on the bi-weekly timesheet for that period. Conversations with stakeholders continued regarding known or perceived gaps in proposed coverage.
