The Office of Information Technology Director of Client Technology Director of Client Technology Director of Client Technology Services provided Match for this grant for the quarter. Match is also provided by the Office of Information Technology Director of Radio Operations who oversees the state radio network (MSCommNet). There was a governance team meeting held on April 30, 2019. FirstNetME team members continued the outreach efforts as either approved by FirstNet or requested by FirstNet and/or AT&T. The annual Maine Municipal Association Technology Conference Bangor, ME on May 10, 2019. Other events where FirstNetME had presence in order to discuss the project and give status updates, sometimes in conjunction with AT&T were: the annual Maine Sheriff's Association, One Monie Emergence Management Association on Conference and one Maine e911 Advisory Council meeting. FirstNetMet to New Hampshire on April 1, 2019 to listen to the AT&T FirstNet presentation of information regarding CoV/COLT devices in advance as similar meeting in Maine the following day. (Carryover narrative) The SPOC position is fully funded by this SLIGP 2 grant. Accrued Match for the grant comes from 55% of the Office of Information Technology Director of Communications and Administration. None of this Match was recorded in the Q1 report, so this Q2 report includes both Q1 and Q2 Match. The OIT Director of Communications and Administration ceased providing match in October and was replaced by the OIT Director of Client Technologies beginning in November. The OIT Director of MSCommNet (the state land mobile radio system) had not been included in earlier reports but has been providing match since March. In Section 14 (Budget Worksheet), Indirect expenses previously reported as Approved Matching Funds were erroneously categorized and have been moved to Federal Funds expended. (New narrative) Match now includes time for administrative and financial personnel for time spent processing invoices and assembling end-of-quarter financial information for reporting purposes. Grant Match continues to be a challenge and we appreciate your time and expertise as we collectively work to resolve the matter.
