Narrative description for each activity reported in Question 11 for this quarter; any challenges or obstacles encountered and mitigation strategies you have employed; planned major activities for the next quarter; and any additional During this quarter, we continued our participation in regualrly scheduled RHSOC /HSAC meetings during the month of July to maintain our PSBN relationship with those local stakeholders. August 4-7, 2 staff attended APCO to gather additional information on PSBN and FirstNet. Staff attended the scheduled presentations and informal meetings with FirstNet staff were also conducted. In addition to the regularly scheduled RHSOC / HSAC meetings (11 total - 9 meetings 285 attendees 2 RHSOC chairs/ HSAC), we attended the Missouri Communications Conference along with FirstNet personnel September 11, presenting to 35 attendees. Two presentations at the SEMA conference was made to approximately 80 attendees total on August 22, and we participated in PSBN meeting August 27 at MARC with approximately 25 attendees. On September 26, our quarterly SIEC meeting was held in Jefferson City and attended by 40 attendees as well as staff from FirstNet. We continue to promote our cache of LTE devices at meetings we attend to help facillitate familiarity with, and adoption of PSBN by first responders (Item # 9 above). We have an agressive lending program that public safety is taking advantage of to better learn of how they might benefit from PSBN. We will continue outreach through the RHSOC network in Q4 and will be conducting our quarterly SIEC meeting. As the adoption of PSBN is becoming more prevalent, we are receiving more requests for agency specific meetings to help in understanding the benefits for their agency, and we will continue to handle those on a case by case basis. We also participated in a demo from AT&T to help better understand the integration of LTE / LMR through FirstNet, on September 19. This was in furtherance of Item #9, above, Planning for Emergency Communications Technology tra
