Narrative description for each activity reported in Question 11 for this quarter; any challenges or obstacles encountered and mitigation strategies you have employed; planned major activities for the next quarter; and any additional project Activity #1 - During this quarter, a Public Safety Broadband Communications Governance Body Meeting was conducted on December 4, 2018 at the New Jersey Office of Homeland Security and Preparedness' (NJOHSP) Hamilton Technology Complex in Hamilton NJ. Jared Maples Director, NJOHSP provided the welcoming remarks and members of the NJOHSP's Interoperability Communications Bureau facilitated discussions on "All Things JerseyNet", "SLIGP 2.0 Project Activities" and "All Things FirstNet". There were approximately twenty people in attendance from various parts of the state. Activities #3 & #8 - The first of three stakeholder workshops as approved by the First Responder Network Authority was completed on October 11, 2018 was held at the Monmouth County Fire Academy in Freehold, NJ. The workshop entitled "Advancing Fire Service Response through Broadband Technology" intended to familiarize New Jersey fire service personnel with the application of broadband wireless technology in a manner that improves the safety of both the firefighter and other public safety personnel as well as the public, increases productivity, and provides improved access to and interpretation of data that enhances operational and tactical responses. The Chief, Interoperable Communications Bureau for NJOHSP moderated the workshop. An overview of FirstNet was presented by the Senior Public Safety Advisor First Responder Network Authority. Our consultant Mission Critical Partners (MCP), assisted in the preparation of the agenda and presented on topics that included "FirstNet Deployment", "Convergence of Public Safety Communications" and "Future Uses of Broadband Wireless". Two guest speakers who are FirstNet users in their respective fire departments – the Los Angeles County Fire Department and the City of St
