2nd Quarter, 2018

One NPSBN meeting was attended in compliance with allowable activities. In June, the FirstNet Director attended the 2018 PSCR Stakeholders meeting San Diego, California. One FTE (.1) joined the FirstNet Program initiative and works in the area of Finance and Accounting, which is identified in the budget as 0.3 FTE. Further collaboration and planning was done with various information technology departments in efforts to create outreach materials and website. The sever regions throughout the state are identified and the counties within these regions are being targeted for direct contact, communication and outreach sessions, to commence in the month of August. 3rd Quarter, 2018

The Alabama FirstNet Program Director attended the Alabama National Emergency Number Association 4th Quarterly Meeting, in compliance with SLIGP 2.0 allowable activities. Four FTE (2.20) joined the Alabama FirstNet Program Initiative and work as the Grant Manager identified in the budget as 1.0 FTE, Legal Counsel identified in the budget as .10 FTE and Communications Manager identified in the budget as .10 FTE. There was one contract terminated for Program Director, Terrance Carson and one contract executed for Meghan Echols, as a replacement. Further collaboration was done with various information technology departments that resulted in the completion of outreach materials, social media and website. The counties within the seven regions previously identified are being targeted for direct contact, communication and outreach sessions, to commence in the month of January. 4th Quarter, 2018

The Alabama FirstNet Program published and distributed the first quarterly FirstNet Alabama newsletter. The newsletter provided readers with an introduction to FirstNet and Promoted upcoming outreach activities. It also highlighted the use of FirstNet technology in support of law enforcement's resolution to a local cold case in Elmore county. The FirstNet Program also launched the State of Alabama FirstNet Website (https://firstnet.alabama.gov/) on November 8, 2018. The website will serve as a source of information regarding FirstNet updates, outreach events, Band 14 tower sites, FAQ's, and FirstNet news. The FirstNet program director attended the quarterly meeting of the Alabama First Responder Wireless Commission (AFRWC) and presented an introductory briefing and communicated strategic plan to stakeholders. The Alabama FirstNet program staff are in the process of finalizing plans for seven educational outreach workshops that will occur in various regions across the State. The workshops were originally scheduled to begin in January 2019, but due to the limited number of registered attendees the January workshops have been rescheduled to begin February 2019.

1st Quarter, 2019

The Alabama FirstNet Program published and distributed the second quarterly FirstNet Alabama newsletter. The newsletter provided readers with an introduction to FirstNet and Promoted upcoming outreach activities. The FirstNet program director attended the quarterly meeting of the Alabama First Responder Wireless Commission (AFRWC) and updated stakeholders on the progress of FirstNet. The Alabama FirstNet program held five educational outreach workshops across the State. The FirstNet Program Director attended the FirstNet board meeting in Jackson, MS.

2nd Quarter, 2019

Efforts have been made to hold outreach workshops for Baldwin and Barbour counties during the month of August. Social media has been utilized to promote attendance. Arrangements have been set in the planning of the Southeastern Broadband Summit that is tentatively scheduled for January of 2020.

3rd Quarter, 2019

The Alabama FirstNet Grant Manager started charging to the SLIGP 2.0 Grant at 1.0 FTE focusing on the creation of education, outreach and awareness opportunities across the counties, establishing a social media presence, maintaining compliance with the performance progress reporting and assisting the Program Director with other grant activities. The Alabama FirstNet Communications Manager and Legal Counsel started charging to the SLIGP 2.0 Grant at .10 FTE each focusing on media coverage and outreach resources and legal matters respectively.
