Presented on interoperability applications to Minnesota's PS Virtual User Forum. Plans for Emergency Communications Technology Transitions: We continue our monthly cadence of the broadband subcommittee meetings to discuss current technology topics specific to broadband (mobile & wired) usage for public safety in South Dakota, ideally looking at interoperability and convergence with LMR. Provided a demo of how interoperability works for boots on the ground to the FirstNet Authority technicians at the FirstNet Innovation and Test Lab (FirstNet Lab). Identified and Planned to Transition PS Apps & Databases: Virtual meeting of the Broadband Sub-committee for SDPSCC Council to review information about various applications. Bill Schrier from FirstNet Authority joined us and discussed the FirstNet App Ecosystem and Intrepid Networks provided a webinar at another meeting. Attended various webinars and reviewed articles on Public Safety Communications. As a member of the Information Sharing Framework Task Force (ISFTF) we reviewed the SAFECOM NCSWIC-ISF document that is an Approach for Developing an Interoperable Information Sharing Framework. Mobile Broadband capabilities and applications were part of the Sturgis Rally Communications plan – a first that broadband was part of the planning sessions to help augment LMR. They utilized Bridge4PS for daily situational awareness, etc. We did not hear of any issues with any of the LTE/Wireless/Cell carriers. For the first time, the SD State Fair Police used mobile broadband and an application (Bridge4PS) specifically to support their operations at the fair. Using the application, they found a missing girl in 6 minutes. Identify Ongoing Coverage Gaps: We discuss coverage issues and build out progress in each weekly meeting with AT&T. Every meeting we attend and every stakeholder we visit with we discuss coverage gaps, and lack or impaired wireless service issues they have in their area. USDA announced more broadband grants in SD. These investments will be in areas well known for being underserved or not served at all. These broadband projects will only improve public safety broadband communications and some of these areas will include backhaul for FirstNet towers. Any challenges or obstacles encountered and mitigation strategies you have employed: Ongoing issue with weekly dialogue is the outage reporting, billing, and ordering processes. The only mitigation strategy is to dialogue weekly and be patient while AT&T improves their business processes. AT&T did another re-organization, that changed some of our support personnel which causes some additional work to re-train the next person as we all work through the transition. We've been contacted by AT&T government affairs office that they are having struggles with some counties permitting some "FirstNet commit" sites. Planned major activities for the next guarter: We will continue to search for interoperable applications (or system) to be used across our state and nationwide. Continue the Public Safety Mobile Broadband subcommittee work. Be a part of the team working on updating our SCIP to ensure broadband and FirstNet technologies are included as needed. Any additional project milestones or information: Submitted 10th Quarter SLIGP2.0 Performance Progress Report and the Federal Financial Report. Other allowable activities performed this guarter include: Quarterly call with our SLIGP2.0 NTIA Program Manager. Our governance council (SD Public Safety Communications Council) met (9/10/20) via video conference with discussion from the broadband committee. Listened to the FirstNet Authority combined board and committee September meeting. Held multiple conference calls with FirstNet Authority Regional Lead. Worked with FirstNet as they had a SatColt available to support the Sturgis Rally and the Presidential visit during the Mt. Rushmore Independence Day fireworks event. Continue to monitor the press and social media for FirstNet knowledge and other LMR/LTE mobile broadband information. We continue collaboration with other neighboring states to discuss FirstNet experiences. Also have conference calls with AT&T (weekly) and FirstNet Authority. Attend (in person/online) various meetings webinars and inform our stakeholders through social media as appropriate.
