Narrative description for each activity reported in Question 11 for this quarter; any challenges or obstacles encountered and mitigation strategies you have employed; planned major activities for the next quarter; and any additional project milestones or information:** Further Identification of Potential Public Safety Users: Presented at the Joint Police Chiefs & Sheriffs Association Spring Meeting. Meeting with Senior VP AT&T/FirstNet Chris Sambar and discussed issues and progress in South Dakota. Attended 2019 Public Safety Broadband Summit for discussion on the latest technology advancements impacting public safety communications networks. Participated in a call (and provided feedback) with the U.S. Government Accountability Office who requested feedback from states in regards to FirstNet. Held the SD Public Safety Communications Council meeting. Attended numerous webinars on Public Safety Communications. FirstNet Authority released a Blog: FirstNet Boosting Communications for Tribal First Responders. FirstNet Program Manager was pictured in the blog with the Police Chief of Yankton Sioux Tribe who is our tribal representative on the SD Public Safety Communications Council, and National Tribal Government Liaison (Regions I-VIII), First Responder Network Authority. <https://www.firstnet.gov/newsroom/blog/firstnet-boosting-communications-tribal-first-responders>. Working to get all Highway Patrol Troopers to have band class 14 devices or at minimum FirstNet SIM's so if a deployable is dispatched – they can manage capacity of the deployable down to FirstNet SIM's, BC 14, or both BC14 and FirstNet SIMs. **Plans for Emergency Communications Technology Transitions:** Had meetings and created documentation on what a common denominator application could look like. I.e. What would be needed for true inherent immediate interoperability. **Identified and Planned to Transition PS Apps & Databases:** Signed a short-term consultant contract to assist us in developing and managing an online survey for public safety and their use/needs of broadband applications. The broadband committee (not in full operation yet) will help guide the survey analytics. This group will also determine what databases are needed to be included in emergency responses. Project manager was asked to be on the Information Sharing Framework Task Force working to establish a data interoperability working group. It is organized by Joint SAFECOM-National Council of Statewide Interoperability Coordinators (NCSWIC) - Homeland Security, Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) Emergency Communications Division (ECD). Attended various webinars about how to enhance emergency services, including FirstNet App Catalog: Apps for Situational Awareness Support. **Identify Ongoing Coverage Gaps:** Every meeting we attend and every stakeholder we visit with we discuss coverage gaps, and lack or impaired wireless service issues they have in their area. AT&T informed us of additional Band Class 14 sites on air in South Dakota currently, and their plans for 2019 and year end 2020. **Any challenges or obstacles encountered and mitigation strategies you have employed:** Local Control Portal issues continue – but we have additional AT&T support working to resolve which has reduced the issues. Problems continue with the FirstNet SIMs/Core causing device issues and degraded services such as dropped calls, less coverage, no service, etc. Currently the users have switched back to the commercial SIM (to the AT&T commercial network) and have not had the problems. For some device issues we've been told we need to upgrade to a new band class 14 device. Thus, we are working with AT&T on an affordable (reduced) pricing offer for a number of identified first responders to purchase band class 14 devices. **Planned major activities for the next quarter:** It is difficult to truly test priority or preemption under normal network usage, so we are looking at the possibility of doing some testing of FirstNet during the Sturgis Rally. We will continue to search for an interoperable application (or system) to be used across our state. We will continue to attend FirstNet-requested public safety stakeholder outreach meetings focused on various topics. **Any additional project milestones or information:** Submitted 5th Quarter Performance Progress Reports, Federal Financial Report, etc. Onsite visit from NTIA program manager. Email from Federal Program Officer for SLIGP program to inform us grantees could extend grant and we are looking at extending the grant period of performance to March 31, 2021. **Other allowable activities performed this quarter include:** Our governance council (SD Public Safety Communications Council) met, and discussion included sustainable communications funding, push to talk, and other applications. Held our SLIGP quarter call with grant program manager and had good discussion on the allowable activities we are working on. Held a FirstNet synch call with our FirstNet Authority Regional Lead. Continue to monitor the press and social media for FirstNet knowledge and other LMR/LTE mobile broadband information. We continue collaboration with other neighboring states to discuss FirstNet experiences. Also have conference calls with AT&T and FirstNet Authority. Attended various meetings and inform our stakeholders through social media as appropriate.
