Narrative description for each activity reported in Question 11 for this quarter; any challenges or obstacles encountered and mitigation strategies you have employed; planned major activities for the next quarter; and any additional project 660-0042 Further Identification of Potential Public Safety Users: Presented to the SD Police Chiefs' Association at the SDML (South Dakota Municipal League) Annual Conference. Discussed State Radio, FirstNet, and the Mobile Broadband Public Safety Date: 01/81/2021 Survey. The AT&T FirstNet team deployed a Satellite Cell on Light Truck (SATCOLT) for the Bison-Jackrabbits rival football game and the activities around ESPN's College GameDay in Brookings South Dakota. They also hosted a hospitality table for first responders and public safety officials. Plans for Emergency Communications Technology Transitions: Attended Cross State Border Emergency Communications Workshop in Marshall, MN. We spent the day talking Emergency Communications with border counties of Minnesota, South Dakota & Iowa. Identified interoperability challenges and opportunities using our existing LMR networks, cell phone usage and mobile broadband. Identified and Planned to Transition PS Apps & Databases Finalized our survey to collect data to determine how Mobile Broadband is being used today in Public Safety. Analyzing information such as what applications are first responders using, what databases do they need access to, what devices do they use, what carrier do they use, and what do they want in the future. The contract has been finalized/fulfilled and we have received all close out materials. Attended various webinars and reviewed articles on Public Safety Communications. Identify Ongoing Coverage Gaps: Every meeting we attend and every stakeholder we visit with we discuss coverage gaps, and lack or impaired wireless service issues they have in their area. We have discussed coverage issues in each weekly meeting with AT&T. Any challenges or obstacles encountered and mitigation strategies you have employed: Local Control Portal issues (slow, non-intuitive, inadequate outage maps, etc.) continue. Problems continue with FirstNet SIMs .vs. AT&T Commercial SIMs, device issues (phones and MiFi's) and degraded services such as dropped calls, less coverage, no service, etc., many areas where AT&T worked fine before FirstNet. These issues are also happening during normal daily usage; i.e. outside of emergency operations. Attended meetings with BIT Administration, AT&T leadership and AT&T RAN Network folks. We provided AT&T a 6-page report of some of the current issues, many of which would be non-existent and resolved if the network service was not degraded and operated properly. We have received an action plan from AT&T and are working through it with future meetings planned, and continue to work through ordering issues, billing issues, vague outage email notifications, and support issues. One major area we are working with AT&T on is their problem reporting process which is arduous, to the point whereas most first responders will not take the time to report problems. AT&T has asked for a laundry list of (many very technical) technical settings and information that quite honestly is too big of an ask of an already too busy first responder. We have suggested AT&T/FirstNet combine their Mark the Spot and FirstNet Assist apps in some fashion. When our users have problems it would be better if they could simply click on a button in the app of the issue (dropped call, degraded service, no data, no service, etc.) and then all the necessary information AT&T technical folks need could come directly from the phone/device without the end user having to know what to send or the need to spend a lot of time notifying AT&T by calling tech support which we all know can take hours of time, which first responders don't have. Planned major activities for the next quarter: We will continue to search for an interoperable application (or system) to be used across our state. We will kick off the first meeting of our Public Safety Mobile Broadband subcommittee during first quarter 2020 and begin with analyzing the results from our survey. We will continue to attend FirstNet-requested public safety stakeholder outreach meetings focused on various topics. Any additional project milestones or information: Submitted 7th Quarter SLIGP2.0 Performance Progress Report and the Federal Financial Report. Signed and submitted the SLIGP2.0 grant "no cost extension" amendment document extending our project until 3/31/2021. As an indicator of increased mobile broadband awareness within South Dakota our largest city (Sioux Falls) is among the first cities in the US to get 5G technology albeit with a different carrier than AT&T/FirstNet. Other allowable activities performed this quarter include: Listened online to the FirstNet Authority combined board and committee meeting. Our governance council (SD Public Safety Communications Council) met (12/12/19) with discussion on FirstNet and the mobile broadband subcommittee. Held our SLIGP quarter call with grant program manager and had good discussion to ensure our work is within the allowable activities of the grant. Held a conference call with FirstNet Authority Regional Lead and discussed plans for next year including possible focus groups, onsite meetings, etc. as we try to accomplish work within the grant allowable activities with FirstNet involved and aware. Continue to monitor the press and social media for FirstNet knowledge and other LMR/LTE mobile broadband information. We continue collaboration with other neighboring states to discuss FirstNet experiences. Also have conference calls with AT&T (weekly) and FirstNet Authority. Attended various meetings and inform our stakeholders through social media as appropriate.
