11b. Please provide a description of each activity reported in response to Question 11; any challenges or obstacles encountered and mitigation strategies you employed; and any additional project milestones or information. 11.1: The Tennessee Advanced Communications Network (TACN) Advisory Panel (AP) met 12 times during the grant period. The AP is comprised by communications personnel representing Tennessee state agencies such as Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency (TWRA), Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI) and Tennessee Department of Corrections (TDOC) to name a few. Discussions included the Nationwide Public Safety Broadband Network (NPBSN), such as credentialing, Land Mobile Radio (LMR) to Long-Term Evolution (LTE), identification of potential users and other allowable activities. 11.8: Identifying stakeholders was one activity that carried through the entire grant period. Through our work with distressed counties, through the TACN AP, and through major event planning, stakeholders were educated on the NPSBN. 11.9: Plans for technology transitions were created throughout the grand period. During the grant period, work began and will continue on the eCOMMFOG for Tennessee with help from CISA.

11c. Did you perform activities during the last quarter of the grant that haven't been reported previously (i.e., new programmatic activities, staffing changes)? If so, please describe.
Due to the Covid 19 pandemic, the TACN Advisory Panel held it's quarterly meeting via MS TEAMS. Development of the eCOMMFOG continues in coordination with Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA). Outreach continued with the distressed counties. Discussions continued regarding coverage and communications solutions via the NPBSN in Grundy, Lake, and Hawkins counties.
11d. Please share any lessons learned or best practices that your organization implemented during your SLIGP 2.0 project.
We learned that adoption of the NPSBN hinges on education and coverage. The dissemination of successful use cases was critical in educating potential users and driving adoption. In addition we learned that smaller events were more successful by creating a personal atmosphere for discussions regarding the NPSBN. Our TACN AP meetings were also successful in finding potential users, demonstrating use cases, and having both the Firstnet Authority and FirstNet/ATT
present on relevant topics, such as the FirstNet Roadmap, LMR to LTE Solutions, coverage, and available applications for use on the network. Tennessee met with FirstNet/AT&T quarterly to discuss coverage concerns and coverage
solutions. These meetings will continue for the forseeable future. Events such as the Middle Tennessee tornado response and the Nashville Christmas Day bombing, provided Tennessee with use cases that highlighted th successes and
hurdles of working with FirstNet/AT&T during an unplanned emergency response.
