11b. Please provide a description of each activity reported in response to Question 11; any challenges or obstacles encountered and mitigation strategies you employed; and any additional project milestones or information.

1) TxPSBP held quarterly calls with FirstNet Authority and AT&T to discuss state plan progress and PSBN buildout, challenges, etc. During SLIGP 1.0, TxPSBP held outreach and education meetings with regional public safety stakeholders around the state. 2) TxPSBP sent individuals to conferences such as PSCR's annual stakeholder conference, APCO, IACP Tech Forums, and IWCE.

3) TXPSBP facilitated an in-person workshop on messaging applications for public safety, which FirstNet representatives attended. TXPSBP held annual meetings with its regional councils of governments and radio system owners to discuss PSBN progress. With the allowable activities and topic restrictions under SLIGP 2.0, it was critical that TXPSBP worked together with FirstNet on engagements whenever possible, in order to address the full spectrum of stakeholder questions and concerns. As SLIGP 2.0 period went on and the network was built out, TXPSBP had a shrinking role in proactive outreach.

4) During SLIGP 2.0, hired staff helped facilitate some of the working groups and events associated with interoperability and NPSBN planning, such as the annual Texas Interoperable Communications Coalition event and workshop on public safety messaging applications.

TXPSBP found that having public safety champions stand alongside FirstNet representatives made a more effective impact at connecting with stakeholders and explaining the value of the Public Safety Broadband Network.

Stakeholders also expressed a desire to see FirstNet be much more than cellular carrier, but rather a provider of solutions to common public safety problems, and a partner.

COVID-19 in the latter half of SLIGP 2.0 cancelled virtually all travel, which exposed how reliant the public safety community was on face-to-face meetings for networking and collaboration. Public Safety Broadband Network stakeholders will need good digital collaboration platforms to encourage effective networking and collaboration, particularly without SLIGP to subsidize travel budgets, and with many agencies facing budget shortfalls.
