TXPSBP also had one in-person meeting on progress of the Texas state plan, network coverage, and network features with AT&T and the FirstNet Authority.

Individuals Sent to Broadband Conferences: TxPSBP sent two people to the NIST-NCCOE identity, credential, and access management (ICAM) workshop in Rockville MD, one person to the IACP Tech Confernence in Jacksonville, FL, and one person to the Public Safety Communications Conference, in Little Rock, AR.

Convened Stakeholder Events: During Q6, TxPSBP convened an in-person meeting in Florence, TX with the FirstNet Authority and the Texas Broaband Applications and Information Sharing Strategic Advisory Group in order to discuss and recommend requirements for data interoperability with chat/collaboration applications.

Major plans for Q7 include participation and/or presentations at: The Texas Interoperable Communications Coalition's annual stakeholder conference, the PSCR Broadband Stakeholder Conference, APCO 2019, and a mobile broadband-focused ICAM workshop in Tennessee in conjunction with the Department of Homeland Security. Additionally, the Texas Broaband Applications and Information Sharing Strategic Advisory Group is on track to publish a white paper on the topic of chat/collaboration application interoperability in Q7, based on lessons learned during the Q6 workshop in Florence, TX.
