11a. Narrative description for each activity reported in Question 11 for this quarter; any challenges or obstacles encountered and mitigation strategies you have employed; planned major activities for the next quarter; and any additional project  
 The Public Safety Broadband Network Commission met on January 16, 2019. The PSBC was briefed by Televate on coverage validation approaches and AT&T representatives provided a detailed update on the buildout in Vermont. VT DPS participated in the January 24 NTIA-webinar on SLIGP 2.0 and Vermont's plan to document coverage needs and gaps. The VT DPS program manager participated in a webinar on FirstNet Application Categories. The VT DPS/PSBC survey of application use was finalized and the results distributed electronically to the commission and first responders and posted on the PSBC web site. A summary story will be included in the next project update newsletter sent to first responders. A challenge for the SLIGP 2.0 work is securing the cooperation of FirstNet in sharing information on how the Authority will validate coverage provided by AT&T. Vermont wants to use the validation process recognized by FirstNet to guide how coverage gaps and needs will be documented in Vermont. We continue planning work with Televate to begin coverage documentation later this year. The VT FirstNet Single Officer participated in a March 27-29 conference in Atlanta, GA on FirstNet in the field. The one-day conference was held by the Police Executive Research Forum for senior public safety professionals. Planning work was begun to include use of the VT-based FirstNet deployable in a statewide emergency management exercise this fall. The intent is to test the AT&T response and VT DPS internal processes for deploying the SatCOLT and refine our emergency procedures.


