Describe your progress meeting each major activity/milestone approved in the Baseline Report for this project; any challenges or obstacles encountered and mitigation strategies you have employed; planned major activities for the next quarter; and any additional project milestones or information.

SPOC & two representatives attended the SPOC meeting in McLean, VA April 12-13. FirstNet Region 8 lead - Tracey Murdock presented to WASCOP (WY Assoc Chiefs Of Police) at meeting Apr 27, 2016 in Casper. Attendance at the meeting was 150 individuals in person. Tracey also presented to LECC (Law Enforcement Coordinating Committee) at meeting June 2, 2016 at Little America, Cheyenne. Attendance at the meeting was again 150 individuals in person. Milestone activities: FirstNet CEO - Mike Poth met with Wyoming Governor Matt Mead at the Western Governor's Association in Jackson, WY June 12, 2016. Existing state employees continue to work on SLIGP, the broadband enterprise architect, SWIC, budget administrator and state leadership, based on number of hours contributed. Capacity planning conversations have begun (Stage 1).

We participate in the State of Wyoming's - PSCC (Public Safety Communications Commission) meetings and give FirstNet updates. June 15, 2016 meeting was held in Riverton, WY. Attendance at the meeting was 18 individuals, representing the commission and emergency responders.

We have created a FirstNet for Wyoming, Google + community, as a single point of information reference for our statewide emergency responders. This is intended for outreach and education, starting with our public safety work group of 25 individuals, but open to any emergency responder.

Participate in the Western States collaboration and meetings because of similar rural issues, and meet with them biweekly. We are relying on State of Wyoming public safety work group and our existing user information from our land mobile radio (LMR) system to determine potential National Public Safety Broadband Network (NPSBN) users. The SWIC is compiling information on current LMR users.

We are continuing to work on GIS maps based on phased approach in the planning for entire LTE state coverage.

The State of Wyoming is now working with CASM and OEC on how to maximize this tool. Along with the CASM tool, the state is continuing Google mapping training. Mapping with Google Earth is great tool for the Public Safety Broadband Work Group. Outreach is also being accomplished, without having to spend funds from the SLIGP grant. It is being mentioned and discussed in statewide public safety association meetings.

The SPOC and SWIC have a very strong working relationship and both bring important networking/communication skills to the project. While Wyoming's small population and large geographic areas will cause challenges in future coverage areas, it is currently an asset for outreach to stakeholders statewide. These two positions continue to leverage relationships, are both champions for this cause and are using this ability to reach out quickly to state/city/county

We continue outreach to the State of Wyoming's public safety working group members, to encourage attendance and participation.

We continue to provide information about SLIGP at these meetings and want members to be engaged with the grant program.

We have had meetings with our state financial team so SLIGP team members are updated with the SLIGP budget.
