

WHAT THEY ARE SAYING: Biden-Harris Administration Awards \$6.47 Million to Ohio in 'Internet for All' Planning Grants

Today, the Department of Commerce's National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA) announced that Ohio received its first planning grants for deploying high-speed Internet networks and developing digital skills training programs under the Biden-Harris Administration's Internet for All initiative. Ohio is receiving \$6,470,550.76 in funding from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, signed by President Biden, to plan for the deployment and adoption of affordable, equitable, and reliable high-speed Internet throughout the state.
