U.S. Government (USG) Internet Oversight

Ladies and Gentlemen:

REFERENCE: Joint Project Agreement (JPA), which grants USG loose control of Internet management

1. BOTTOM LINE UP FRONT -- ACTION RECOMMENDED. Recommend that the President of the United States exercise his option to extend reference agreement,

thereby retaining USG involvement in Internet management.

## 2. RATIONALE:

- a. the Internet is not yet ready to be transitioned to private or international management. Furthermore, there are serious concerns about DNS security that remain unresolved.
- b. America has been criticized for keeping a tight hold on the Internet, but this is not the complete story. The U.K., The Netherlands, Sweden,

and Japan all control root zones. The U.S. does not have a total monopoly on the Internet as sometimes suggested. Frequently, the critics of U.S. management are the same 5 governments: China, Russia, Syria, Iran and Venezuela. Each of these regimes have questionable human rights, free speech, and

free press records and as such are threatened by the free flow of information.

c. For a number of years, USG and private sector entities have been under various forms of computer network attack by a wide variety of malefactors. In response, the President has appointed a Cyber Czar within his

National Security Staff structure and the Department of Defense is reportedly preparing to stand up a Cyber Command, a unified combatant command, under Lieutenant General (U.S. Army) Keith Alexander, currently serving as Director of the National Security Agency.

3. RECAP: On its face, the option of not renewing the JPA appears most unwise. Unless Ms. Melissa Hathaway and LTG Alexander both sign off on the proposal, I would not that the President and the USG not do it.
